Rick Behrens, Senior Manager, Strategic Development, Boeing Integrated Defense Systems

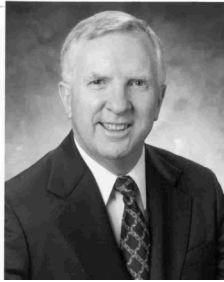

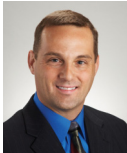
